Examination Handbook

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- 1. How do I register to test? There is a two (2) step process required to schedule your test. You must first create a test request on Prov's system and make your exam fee payment. Then, within a few weeks you'll receive instructions from ARRT on how to schedule your exam.
- WHERE CAN I TEST? You will schedule your test at one of Pearson Vue's testing centers. Please note: you will not be able to schedule your exam until you have received your exam packet from ARRT.
- 3. **How Much Does IT Cost?** Each examination event costs **\$200**. This fee is the same whether you are testing for the first time or are retaking an exam.
- 4. WHEN DO I GET MY TEST RESULTS? After you take an exam, you'll receive a preliminary scaled score at the test center. This isn't your final score.

Within three weeks of your exam, Prov will release your score report, via email. Your score report will reveal your total score and show your relative performance by content area.

GENERAL TESTING INFORMATION

The purpose of this handbook is to provide you information about taking your licensing examination with the State of Utah.

The Division has contracted with Prov, Inc. to process your registration for the following ARRT examinations:

- Bone Densitometry Equipment Operator
- Limited Scope of Practice in Radiography

The process begins when you access Prov's online scheduler, you select the test you wish to take, then you make your exam payment.

Prov will upload test taker information, once per week into the ARRT website. Once you have been approved to test, ARRT will mail you a handbook and status report. These documents will explain the entire examination process including how you will Schedule your exam with Pearson Vue. You will be assigned a 90-day examination window (the time period in which you must test) and will be given scheduling instructions.

NOTE: To become licensed you must have taken and passed the Limited Scope Core and one or more of the following: Chest, Extremities, Skull/sinus, Spine and/or Podiatric examination(s). Upon completion of all licensure requirements, including passing the appropriate examination, submit a completed application for licensure to DOPL. Applications for licensure are available online at http://www.dopl.utah.gov/rad/.

EXAMINATION CATEGORIES & COST

The examination cost **\$200**. Per testing event. The fee is the same whether you are testing for the first time or if you are retaking the exam. For the Limited Scope exam, the fee is the same regardless of the number of parts you are taking.

WHERE TO TAKE YOUR EXAM IN UTAH

The ARRT National Radiology examinations are delivered by computer by Pearson Vue. When you receive your registration confirmation from ARRT, you will be provided instructions for scheduling with Pearson Vue.

How to Register Online

Step 1: Go to the following website to begin the registration process:

http://www.provexam.com/register.

Step 2: Under the title, **Select Certifying Body**, select:

UT – National Radiology

Step 3: Under Select a License/Certificate, select one of the following:

National Radiology Bone Densitometry (ARRT)

National Radiology Limited Scope of Practice in Radiology (ARRT)

Then press **NEXT**.

Step 4: Enter your personal information. Please enter all of the required information then select **SAVE CHANGES**.

Step 5: In the region titled "Exams Available for Scheduling" select the following:



If you are taking the Limited Scope, all six (6) of the possible exams will be added to your cart. If you do not want to take all of the modules, use the cancel symbol to remove specific modules from the cart.

Press MAKE PAYMENT.

Step 6: Make payment via credit card.

NEXT STEPS IN THE SCHEDULING PROCESS

Prov will use your registration information and will submit it to ARRT. ARRT will process your registration and will mail you a packet of information that will include instructions on scheduling your test with **PearsonVue**. This may typically take up to 3 weeks.

After you test with Pearson Vue, your exam results will be made available within 3 weeks. Prov will then email you a score report.

Prov will automatically upload results to Utah's system.

CANCEL/RESCHEDULING POLICY

Your registration cannot be cancelled once it has been made. However, once you have scheduled your exam with Pearson Vue, you do have the option of contacting them to reschedule your exam date. Please refer to their policy on exam rescheduling.

PREPARING FOR YOUR EXAM

The licensing examination that you will take has been designed to test your technical knowledge of Bone Densitometry Equipment Operator and/or Limited Scope of Practice in Radiography

Prov recommends that you prepare for your exam by familiarizing yourself with the subject areas listed in each exam description.

RESULTS REPORTING

To assure national uniformity, ARRT® provides DOPL with a nationally recommended score. A percentage score of 75 has been established as the standard of minimum competency and 100 is the highest score possible. However, legal authority for making a licensing decision rests solely with DOPL and not with ARRT®.

Examination scores will be reported approximately **3** weeks following the examination.
